### **FUN FACTS ABOUT PINOT NOIR**

The name is derived from the French words for "pine" and "black" alluding to the varietals' tightly clustered dark purple, pine cone-shaped bunches of fruit.

This wine pairs best with buttery, bold textures like lamb, duck, and for the vegetarian think Portobello mushrooms. The supple tannins cut through rich fat and underlying berry tones will enhance earthy characteristics in your cuisine.

Pinot Noir is meant to be drunk. Unlike other red wines, its life does not improve after 10 years of lying down.

For growing Pinot grapes, it is best to be close to the ocean without seeing the water. In other words, you'll want mountains to interfere with your view so that the wind and fog are trapped in the lower-lying valleys and smaller ridges.

The juice of the pinot berry is clear, not red - the thin skin gives it color during the fermentation process.
